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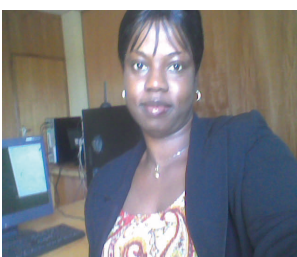

The deployment of technology infrastructure will create a computer based learning environment. This will be underscored by innovation, access to learning and teaching resources, socio-cultural

exchanges, and accurately measured learning and teaching performance.

Technology enabled learning is an inevitable paradigm shift to a learning environment underscored by information and communication technology tools, protocols, infrastructure and digital content.

One of the mobile technologies currently being embraced by schools worldwide is the **Intel Powered Class Mate PC**. A small, mobile learning assistant and educational solution that Intel specially developed for students in emerging markets. It's a

rugged learning device designed to provide affordable, collaborative learning environments.

### The Pilot School in Jabi

As part of efforts designed to make the **Intel Powered Classmate PC**, an everybody tool of teaching and learning in Nigerian schools, Intel Corporation, in collaboration with Education Trust Fund, designed a fully equipped e-classroom to assist students in GSS Jabi, Abuja the nation's capital to ascertain the workability of the initiative in a Nigerian environment.

The pilot test in Jabi was indeed a huge success, as the students, teachers and parents are yet to recover from the positive impact the project has made and is still making on them.

The pilot test, sponsored by ETF, was carried out with engineering prototype of the Classmate PCs for a period of nine months (one school calendar year); after which over 3000 quantity were purchased for the school. It's been a tremendous experience ever since. New classrooms have been built and the entire school has indeed transformed because of this

## CLASSMATE PC DEPLOYMENT COMMENCES IN 28 JUNIOR SECONDARY

who are directly in charge of junior secondary schools, after an unsatisfactory selection initially made by ministries of education.

After what seemed like an endless wait, 10 states out of the 18 states proposed for the ETF-TEL Project have submitted list of schools qualified to participate in the TEL project. The states are:

**Adamawa, Bauchi, Ebonyi, Edo, Enugu, Jigawa, Ogun, Oyo, Zamfara and FCT**

Seventeen out of the eighteen states each submitted three schools while FCT submitted a school, having satisfied the following basic criteria, namely:

1. Availability of power by PHCN
2. Availability of at least 5KVA generator
3. Adequate storage space for the CMPCs
4. Adequate number of furniture in the project designated classrooms.
